**Reading of Previous Month's Minutes**- Commissioner Looper

**Reading of Treasury Report** – Commissioner Looper

(\$28,187.53 in Checking Account, \$10,057 in Savings, and no deposits or expenditures). Motion was made by Commissioner Looper to accept reports, seconded by Commissioner James, and passed unanimously

**Fifth District Crime Report**- Commander William Fitzgerald. There is a 17% reduction in crime in comparison with the previous months' statistics. There is a 6% reduction in violent crimes. New foot patrol beats have been established in Langdon Park, the Franklin and Evarts Streets community, and the nightclub areas.

**MPDC Narcotic Enforcement**- Inspector Hoey reported 8 firearms were recovered during the month; 55 arrests of prostitutes and their customers; and 200 pounds of synthetic marijuana confiscated. An inspection of several stores for synthetic marijuana resulted in two stores being shut down.

**Mayor Muriel Bowser**- The Mayor presented her position on the Pepco/Excelon Merger and Homelessness in the city. She took questions from the Commission and the community.

**Councilmember Anita Bonds** informed the community of the definition of Affordable Housing, the Inclusionary Zone (IZ), and grants for home repairs for the elderly. She took questions from the community.

**Ward 5 Councilmember Kenyan McDuffie** representative Liaisha Dougherty announced the locations the Councilmember will be meeting with the community. She answered questions from the Commission and the community.

**The Commission** considered MMA by TMI's request to obtain a liquor license at 2066 Rhode Island Avenue, NE. There were concerns about impact on the community, noise, trash, and parking. Commissioner Looper moved to pass a resolution in opposition of the permit application, seconded by Commissioner Smith, and passed unanimously.

Motion to adjourn was made by Commissioner Manning seconded by Commissioner Brevard, and passed unanimously.
