Minutes for February 17, 2016

Meeting Called to Order – 7:04 pm

A quorum was not established at that time.

Mayor Muriel Bowser’s Representative Tommie Jones publicized the Mayor’s newsletter and her plans for our homeless citizens.

Quorum was established at 7:05 pm with the arrival of Commissioner Looper.

Motion to approve the Meeting Agenda with an additional agenda item (5C07), was made by Commissioner Treadway, seconded by Commissioner Looper, and passed collectively.

Commissioner James arrived at 7:10 pm followed by Commissioner Smith’s arrival at 7:12 pm

Reading of Minutes of Previous Month’s Meeting- The reading was waived and a motion was made by Commissioner Brevard to accept the report; seconded by Commissioner Looper; and approved collectively by the Commission.

Reading of Treasury Report- Commissioner Looper reported a balance of \$33,166.67 in the ANC 5C account which includes \$465.45 (to Commissioner Looper from Spring 2015) in expenditures and a \$1,524.67 disbursement from the Office of the ANC. Commissioner Looper entered a motion for the approval of the report; seconded by Commissioner Treadway; and passed collectively.

Fifth District Crime Report- PSA 503 Sergeant Herring reported no crime statistics were available. He added, in the two weeks prior to this meeting, patrols were increased in the area of Langdon Park and the 3200 Block Ft. Lincoln Drive for robbery prevention.

ANC 5C07 (Commissioner Treadway) introduced a protest against the issuance of a liquor license to the Bodega Market, 2409 Franklin Street, NE. The Commission entertained questions. Later, Commissioner Treadway moved that the Commission adopt the protest application; which was seconded by Commissioner James; and passed unanimously by the Commission.

PRESENTATIONS:

DC WASA Representative Emmanuel Briggs reported an update of the DC Water and Sewage activities in the area of 24th and Thayer Street, NE

Friends of the National Arboretum-John Costello informed the community of the upcoming garden fair (April 29-30, 2016), and their request for Letters of Support from the Commission for their request for grants from DOEE and the Endowment of the Arts. A motion was entered by Commissioner Manning; seconded by Commissioner James; and passed collectively by the Commission.

Commissioner Looper introduced a Resolution for a DDOT study of New York Avenue. A motion was entered by Looper; seconded by Manning; and passed collectively by the Commission

Commissioner Looper introduced Resolutions to conduct feasibility studies to update and rename Thurgood Marshall School and Fort Lincoln Park in honor of President and Mrs. Obama, respectively. After entertaining questions, a motion was first entered by Commissioner Looper to update and rename the Park; seconded by Commissioner Treadway; and passed by the Commission with Commissioner James abstaining. Commissioner Looper then entered a motion to update and rename the school; seconded by Commissioner Smith; and passed by the Commission with an abstaining vote by Commissioner James.

Community Announcements – The floor was open to all who wanted to speak regarding their community activities and events such as Woodridge South, Friends of the Woodridge Library, the Arboretum Civic Association, and Seabury Senior Services.

Motion to adjourn was made by Commissioner Manning; seconded by Commissioner Looper; and passed collectively. Next Meeting is set for March 16, 2016
